Bodham Parish Council has been notified that MW White, the company who provides and collects the paper recycling bank will discontinue this service at the end of the summer.

The use of these facilities generally has dwindled over the years whilst contamination with cardboard has increased meaning the service is no longer financially viable.

There does not appear to be an alternative provider at this stage so this likely means the end of the paper bank, Please do continue to use it, the Parish Council receives revenue in the form of recycling credits which we can use to improve the village. Thank you to everyone who has done this over the years. The bottle bank and clothing bank are unaffected.
